Wetland 1	(b)(4)(v) Water-filled depressions created in dry land incidental to mining or construction activity	Wetland 1 is a stormwater run-off fed, isolated, emergent wetland that developed as the result of site stripping and grading that occurred around 2004. Internal resources do not reveal that there was a wetland at this location prior to 2005. Historic aerial photos and information provided by the landowner demonstrate that prior to 4/2005, the site was used for agriculture and between 4/2005 and 5/2005, it was stripped and graded in anticipation of construction of a housing development. A wet signature appears at the location of Wetland 1 immediately after the stripping and the development of the adjacent property. A site visit revealed that there is a berm between the two sites, encouraging water to settle at the bottom of the berm. This property one was left undeveloped after the 2005 grading. A review of subsequent aerial photos show Wetland 1 developing over the years.
Wetland 2	(b)(4)(v) Water-filled depressions created in dry land incidental to mining or construction activity	Wetland 2 is a stormwater run-off fed, isolated, emergent wetland that developed as the result of site stripping and grading that occurred around 2004. Internal resources do not reveal that there was a wetland at this location prior to 2005. Historic aerial photos and information provided by the landowner demonstrate that prior to 4/2005, the site was used for agriculture and between 4/2005 and 5/2005, it was stripped and graded in anticipation of construction of a housing development. There is no wet signature on the aerial photos for this very small wetland. A site visit dated 9/4/2015 and pictures provided in the report reveal standing water limited to ruts at this location.
Wetland 3	(b)(4)(v) Water-filled depressions created in dry land incidental to mining or construction activity	Wetland 3 is a stormwater run-off fed, isolated, emergent wetland that developed as the result of site stripping and grading that occurred around 2004. Internal resources do not reveal that there was a wetland at this location prior to 2005. Historic aerial photos and information provided by the landowner demonstrate that prior to 4/2005, the site was used for agriculture and between 4/2005 and 5/2005, it was stripped and graded in anticipation of construction of a housing development. There is no wet signature on the aerial photos for this very small wetland. A site visit dated 9/4/2015 and pictures provided in the report reveal standing water limited to ruts at this location.
Wetland 4	(b)(4)(v) Water-filled depressions created in dry land incidental to mining or construction activity	Wetland 4 is a stormwater run-off fed, isolated, emergent wetland that developed as the result of site stripping and grading that occurred around 2004. Internal resources do not reveal that there was a wetland at this location prior to 2005. Historic aerial photos and information provided by the landowner demonstrate that prior to 4/2005, the site was used for agriculture and between 4/2005 and 5/2005, it was stripped and graded in anticipation of construction of a housing development. There is no wet signature on the aerial photos for this very small wetland. A site visit dated 9/4/2015 and pictures provided in the report reveal this is a small depressional area.
